## Depart from Our Labor and Weariness and Enter God's Wonder

## Main Bible Verse:

(Matthew 11:28) "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest.

## Summary:

- 1. Jesus taught us, in order to receive the peace of God, we must depart from our ways of being the wise and learned; in order to enter God's creation and His plan, we must depart from our labor and weariness. This is a great blessing and promise of God. (Matthew 11:25-26)
- 2. Coming to church, is to have a date with God. Instead of coming to church by ourself, God is even more pleased when we bring our whole family before God and worship Him. It is essential for our children to know that only God can solve all our problems, therefore, we must teach our children to learn to call out to God and to rely on Him. When we seek God, trusting in His guidance and creation, God will bestow His peace in our family.
- 3. By Jesus' wounds we are healed. He was delivered over to death for our sins and was raised to life for our transgression, so all those who believe in Him could receive peace and eternal life. God created heaven and earth and He is the creator of our future, our savior. (John 1:3)
- 4. (Matthew 24:21-22) There is tribulation at the end time, but Jesus has already told us not to let our hearts be troubled. Instead, we should daily walk with Jesus, live a life of praise, and learn to trust in God and to rely on Him, and become the elect. (John 14:1)
- 5. If we do not depart from our ways of being the wise and learned, but to rely on our own feelings, we will be vulnerable to Satan's attack, for it came to steal, kill, and destroy. On the other hand, when we come to church to learn to call out to God, and to trust in God to set us free, we will receive the peace of God. (Psalms 18:1-3)
- 6. (Psalms 34:3-7) When we continue to live a life of praise, the glory of God will be upon us. When we call out to God and fix our eyes on Him, God will save us out of all our troubles. Our faces are never covered with shame, for the angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear him, and he delivers them.
- 7. Those who call out to the Lord during hardships, will receive faith and be empowered. When we trust in God and call out to His name until the Holy Spirit come upon us, we will be able to overcome, for only God is able, with God all things are possible.
- 8. Jesus taught us to deny ourselves, take up the cross, and follow Him. Deny ourselves, is the way to depart from our own feelings and our ways of being the wise and learned. (Matthew 16:24)
- 9. (Psalms 33:16-19) In our daily lives, we face many issues, and make many decisions. But we must be careful not to let the issues make us weary and burdened. In our marriage, career, investment, and all things in our lives, we must learn to seek God's will and His direction. Jesus loves to help us, but we must not rely on our feelings, on other people, or on our might or power, but to rely on the Spirit of the Lord.
- 10. We must realize that our feeling is not the truth. Relying on our feelings and experiences makes us vulnerable to attacks and could lead us to make wrong decisions, and these wrong decisions would become our burden. Therefore, we must learn to rely on the Holy Spirit to help us. (John 10:10)
- 11. When we come to church, we must learn to pardon our enemies and to pray for them. We must love them with God's love and to treat them with kindness.
- 12. Nothing is more important than bringing people before God. We must learn to help others to receive the salvation of Jesus. This is the true value of our lives. (Luke 9:24-25)

- 13. How do we receive many times as much in this age, and in the age to come eternal life? (Luke 18:28-30) The key is to learn to let go. When you work for the kingdom commission, all the time you put in God's hand would be remembered. Not only you will not miss out on any blessings on earth, God will add more power and authority on to you. (Luke 19:15-19)
- 14. All that you have done for the Lord will be remembered in heaven, and God will bless you with the authority to manage and to take care on earth, and you will receive the blessings in heaven.
- 15. Who do the infants and children in Psalms 8:2 represent? Those who obey God's command with a simple heart and worship Him wholeheartedly. These are the people who are filled with the Holy Spirit daily and speak in tongue to declare the wonders of God.
- 16. How do we become the infant and children? Before Jesus accent to heaven, he taught us not to leave Jerusalem, which means do not stop attending church meetings. Hebrews 10:25-26 taught us, not giving up meeting together, as some are in the habit of doing, but encouraging one another—and all the more as you see the Day approaching. If we deliberately keep on sinning after we have received the knowledge of the truth, no sacrifice for sins is left.
- 17. When the disciples understood, they returned to church with non-stop worship. They were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues as the Spirit enabled them declaring God's wonders. (Acts 2:1-4, 11)

## **Conclusion:**

- What is the wonders of God? It is God's will and revelation; the way and instruction God has given us.
- The wonders of God will help us depart from our labor and weariness and enter the peace of God. This is the mystery of speaking in tongue.
- (Matthew 11:25-26) At that time Jesus said, "I praise you, Father, Lord of heaven and earth, because you have hidden these things from the wise and learned, and revealed them to little children. Yes, Father, for this is what you were pleased to do.
- This is what God is pleased to do, to have us come to church and depart from our own ways of wise and learned, hence, depart from our labor and weariness and enter the peace and blessings of God.
