Main Bible Verse: Psalms 68:1-6 & Corinthians 15:35-58

v (1 Corinthians 15:51-57) Listen, I tell you a mystery: We will not all sleep, but we will all be changed—in a flash, in the twinkling of an eye, at the last trumpet. For the trumpet will sound, the dead will be raised imperishable, and we will be changed. For the perishable must clothe itself with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality. When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory." "Where, O death, is your victory? Where, O death, is your sting?" The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

- We must give thanks to God for everything He has done for us.
 - We need to learn to count our blessings.
 - o It is a blessing that we can come to church to worship Him.
 - A thanksgiving life is the life of being Raptured.
 - Jesus said, for the sake of the elect, the days of the great distress will be cut short.

1 Corinthians 15:51-58 | John 11:11 | John 1:1-4

- Verse 51 tells us a mystery:
 - Victorious Christians who fall asleep will raise from the tomb when Jesus comes.
 - Eventually everyone will raise from the grave and face judgements.
 - Jesus woke up Lazarus, for He is the Lord of life; he said death is not "dead" but "fall asleep".
 - o Because Jesus is the Word in the beginning. By the word of Jesus, the one who fall asleep will all wake up.
- We do not all die, but we will all change.
 - Change is, when the trumpet sounds, the perishable will be clothed with imperishable, the mortal with immortality.
 - Death is swallowed up in victory, for God gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.
- We must do more of God's work.

Mark 16:17-18 | Psalms 8:2 | 1 Corinthians 14:18

- Jesus said that these signs will accompany those who believe:
 - o In Jesus' name they will drive out demons.
 - o They will speak in new tongues.
 - o They will pick up snakes with their hands.
 - When they drink deadly poison, it will not hurt them at all.
 - This does not mean we purposely eat or drink unhealthily. It is when we unknowingly or accidentally eat or drink something bad, it will not hurt us at all.
 - They will place their hands on sick people, and they will get well.
- In Jesus' name we must drive out demons and speak in new tongues, then the snake will not affect us.
 - o Addiction (gambling) is a snake, unforgiveness is a snake, cannot stop shopping is a snake... Etc.
 - We need to daily kneel down before God, read the Bible, and pray in tongues.
 - The devil is the most afraid of speaking in tongues because it drives out demons.
 - o And only God can understand the tongues; it's a spiritual mystery.
 - o Speaking in tongues is a mystery. When we speak in tongues, the demons will flee.
 - That is why when the Holy Spirit moves, the senior pastor will call us out and lay his hand on us. When we fall down, our negativity will go away. When we get up, the affirmative and creation of Jesus will enter us.
- What is speaking in tongues?
 - Speak in tongues is ordain praise (establish strongholds, spiritual power)
 - O Speak in tongues is the only way to silence the foes and avengers. They will not be able to disturb or attack you.

- o Speak in tongues will bring the mysteries and miracles of God upon us. We must be filled with the Holy Spirit.
- o That is why Paul is thankful that he speaks in tongues a lot.
- What is coming to church meetings?
 - o Come to worship God.
 - o Come to meet God and fellowship with God.
 - o Coming to receive the Holy Spirit.
 - o Coming to receive anointing and miracles from God.
 - o Come with empty hands but go home with mysteries and abundance.

Hebrews 1:14 | Malachi 3:16 | 1 Corinthians 15:58

- Angels are ministering spirits sent by God to serve those who will inherit salvation.
- Angels will help keep track of what we do.
 - o Come to church early to pray and prepare our heart to receive God's word.
 - o Angels do not just take attendance; they also mark down our arrival time.
 - We must love Jesus and love church, and the angels will serve and help you.
