Main Bible Verse:

(John 18:6) When Jesus said, "I am he," they drew back and fell to the ground.

Summary:

John 18:6

- We must believe that God's "I am He" can do everything for us.
 - When we truly understand Jesus' "I am He" we will be prosperous.
- It is not done by you or me, but it is done by Jesus' "I am He"
- No matter what we want, we must come before God and let His "I am He" enter us.
 - He will help to get rid of our fears.
- We must let go of our human will and fall before God.
 - When we fall, God will be able to open a new and living way for us.
 - When we rise back up, we will be a new creation in Christ.
 - We will have Jesus' power and lead us into success.
- The answer to all of our problems is Jesus' "I am He"

Acts 9:1-6

- Through Paul we can see the importance of Jesus' "I am He"
 - As he neared Damascus on his journey, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice say to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" "Who are you, Lord?" Saul asked. "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting," he replied.
 - This is the key to the turning point of Saul's life.
- God will solve all of our problems, but we must first lose our own feelings.
- When God performs His miracles, we will be able to see His light.
- Church is a place to meet God.
 - We must come to worship Him until we meet him, and He will create miracles for us.
 - When we meet God, He will give us His plan for us.
- When we come to church to lift up our hands, God's revelation will be upon us.
- We must yearn for God's "I am He"
 - What we want may not be the best for us, but God's way will always be the best.
 - He knows what we need, and He will give it to us through his "I am He"
 - We must, in the name of the Holy Spirit, receive anointing and our new and living way.
 - When we have anointing, we will be full health and we will sleep well at home.

Genesis 22:1-12 | Hebrews 11:17-19

- Wherever God wants us to go, we must go there.
 - Our offerings must be at the location where God dictates.
- When Abraham went to the location that God had instructed and was about to use his knife to sacrifice Isaac, the angel told him, "Do not lay a hand on the boy," he said. "Do not do anything to him. Now I know that you fear God, because you have not withheld from me your son, your only son."
- When God said, "now I know," it meant that He would be the word become flesh and come down to earth.

- God decided that he would be the word become flesh to be sacrificed.
- This “now I know” is not regarding to Abraham willingness to sacrifice for God.
- Abraham had faith that God would raise Isaac from the dead even if he had been sacrificed.
 - This is why Abraham was willing to sacrifice Isaac.

Luke 23:34 | Matthew 6:12

- Jesus on the cross said, “Father forgive them for they do not know what they are doing”
 - This “do not know what they are doing” is a contrast to the “now I know” from when Abraham was willing to sacrifice Isaac to God.
 - This is why Abraham became the father of faith.
- We need to forgive others’ debts before we can have God forgive our debts.
- The more we forgive the more God will forgive us.
- When we come to church we must receive Jesus’ “I am He”
 - The way to receive Jesus’ “I am He” is to love God, worship, kneel down and pray, repent and return, and forgive others.
